

TODAY'S MARKETS

THE LOCAL MARKET.

London, Thursday, Oct. 29.

The market was not so far as supplies and attendance were concerned. The wet and disagreeable weather doubtless prevented many of the farmers from attending the market. Prices were unaltered to any extent, with the exception of dressed hogs and potatoes.

Grain—Twenty loads of oats sold higher, at 85c to 90c per cwt. No wheat offered. Hay and straw—Eighteen loads of hay were on the stand; sales were easily made, at 30c to 31c per ton; only two loads at the last-named price.

Butter and Eggs—The supply of butter was light; prices ranged from 15c to 16c for crocks and 15c to 20c for pound rolls. Eggs were firm and in good demand, at 25c to 26c per dozen wholesale.

Vegetables and Root—There were about 15 large loads of potatoes offered; prices ranged from 10c to 11c per bag, the latter figures for a single bag. Onions a slow sale, at 60c to 65c per bag. Turnips, 25c to 30c per bag.

Fruits—Very light supply in this line, and consisted of apples, which were sold at 50c to 55c per barrel. Grapes were plentiful, at 20c to 30c per 10-pound basket.

Poultry—Prices ruled about the same as per quotations a few large lots of dressed turkeys sold at 10c to 12c per pound wholesale.

Dressed Meats—There was a lot on sale, with no change in prices.

Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat, 35 cars; corn, 150 cars; oats, 150 cars; hogs, 24,000 head.
