# TAFT DECLARES

President Makes Public Reference to the Panama Canal Bill.

PARTS NOT GERMANE

Says Americans Have Right to Their Own Interpretation of Hay-Pauncefote Treaty.

New London, Conn., Sept. 6.— Standing on a platform erected within the rampart of historic Fort Griswold, President Taft, in a speech before the Atlantic Deeper Waterways Association today, replied to his critics who charge that the Panama Canal bill which he signed shortly before Congress adjourned, is a violation of the Hay-Pauncefote treaty with Great Britain.

"There were some things in the Panama bill I did not think germane, said the president, "and might as well have been left out. Of course, we are not in favor of violating a treaty with a foreign power, but we have the same right to interpret the treaty that they have. We do not believe that we have violated the treaty by granting to coastwise vessels free passage through the canal."
