TORONTO, Sept. 10.—Hon. W. S. Fielding made an exceedingly popular speech at the big Liberal meeting here tonight. There would be no Fordney barrier if reciprocity had carried, and cattle would have been sent to the States. The Liberal party would revise the tariff downward, he said.

"It's good to be here," he said, as the cheering subsided after he was called upon to sing the time-shine. "I've been in a real old-fashioned political meeting like this."

**The Best System.**

"We have the best reciprocity system is the best that civilization has developed in the matters of government," he said, "in spite of the tendency to brood over the tariff."

"There is one thing sure," he continued, "and that is that this Government is hopelessly beaten in this election from the start. I haven't met a Conservative in this country who has the faintest idea that the Melghen Government will be returned to power."

Mr. Fielding stated that a few years ago if any party attempted to spend money without submitting accounts to the general alarm would be spread that they were striking at the very root of parliamentary government.
