GET HIGH PRICES FOR SHORTHORNS

Cattlemen at Guelph State Average Better Than \$300.

GUELPH, Dec. 7.—In the first big Canadian sale of milking Shorthorns held in the Victoria Ring here today, approximately 40 head, mostly females, sold for an average of over \$300.

Cows purchased by A. McLaren of Buckingham, Quebec, making an average of better than \$500 apiece.

The consignors to the sale were N. G. Stoner of Theford, R. R. Wheaton of Thorndale, E. W. Carter of Iderton and W. E. Johns of Woodham.

There was a fair attendance and the bidding was brisk. The average price for the sale is good, considering the existing conditions of the market for pure-bred cattle, cattlemen say.

The top price, \$725, was paid by Mr. McLaren for Gratia 5th, consigned by R. R. Wheaton. The average price for the females, irrespective of some younger stuff, was \$354.
