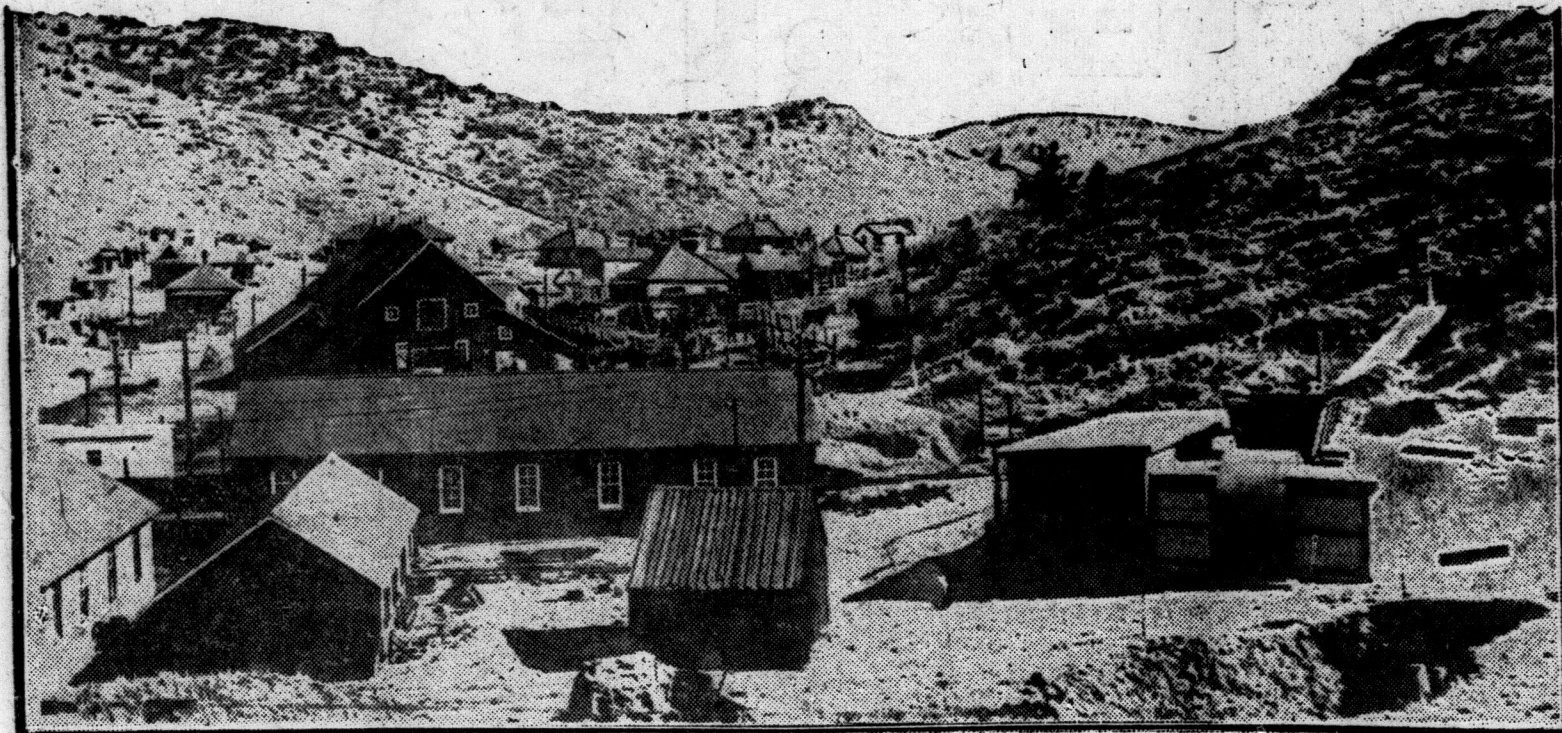

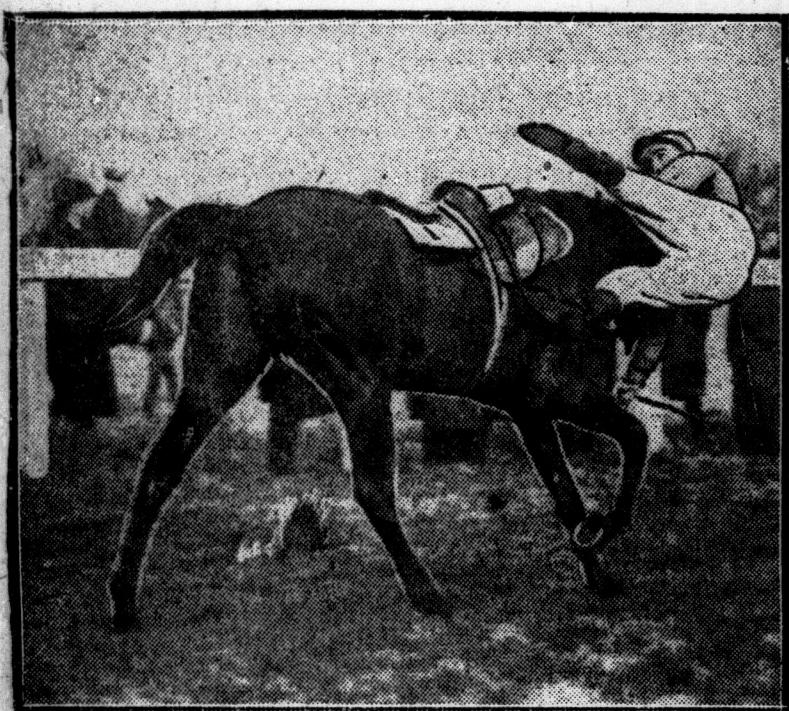
Wanda Hawley, movie star, is suing her husband for divorce. He threatens to start a counter-suit.

"Mile End" getting rid of his jockey at the last hurdle of a recent handicap race in Windsor, England.



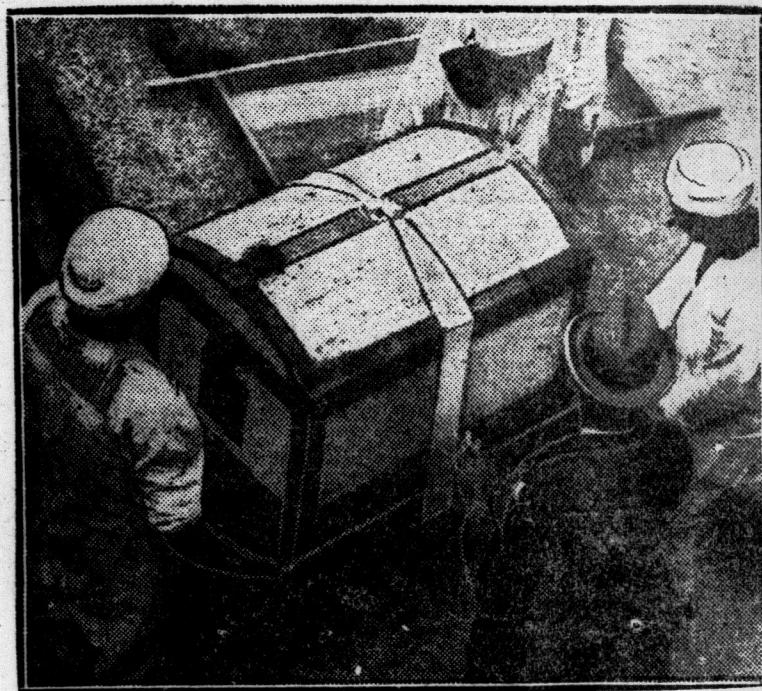
Edith Bennett, American concert star, who has been engaged to sing the first complete concert by radio from America to Europe.

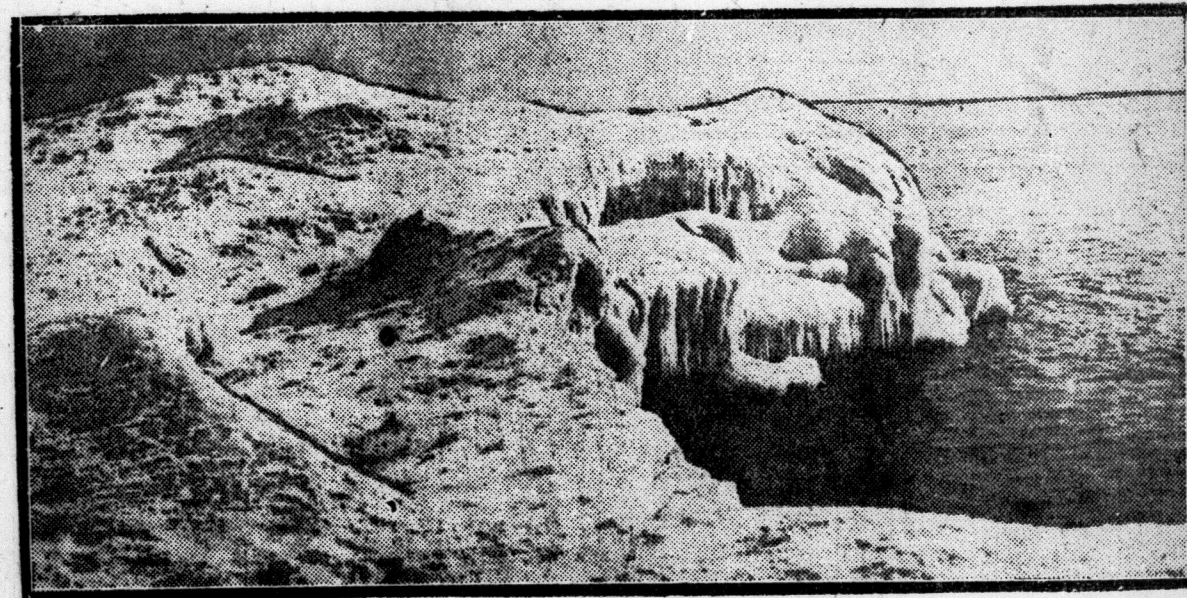
First photo taken in New York of Miss Gloria Morgan, whose engagement to Reginald Vanderbilt has just been announced. She is eighteen years of age.



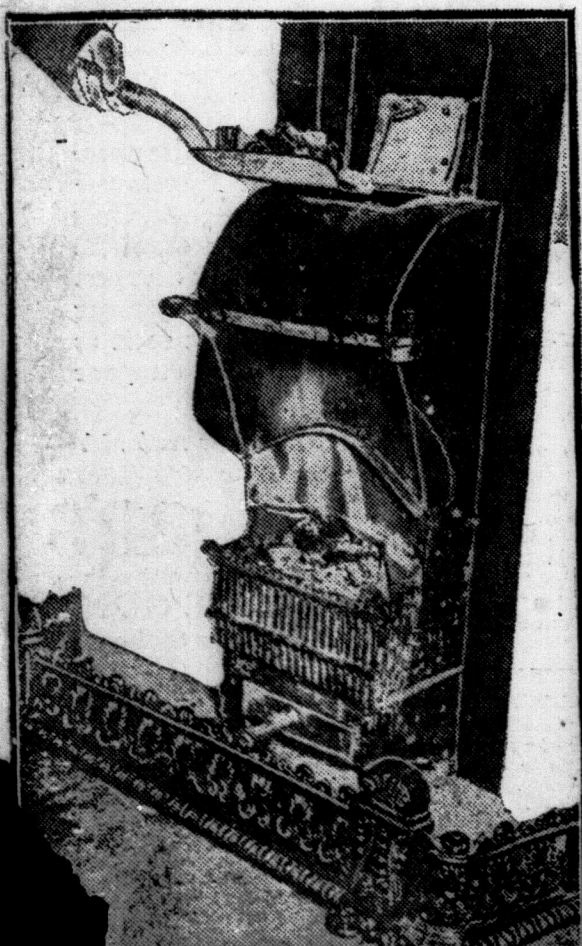
Removing a chest of linen from the tomb of King "Tut" at Luxor, Egypt.
