Villa, the little brown man from the Philippines, the first Oriental to have held a world's championship, had hardly inspired affection. but had earned the respect of fistiana as one of the greatest little fighting machines to sit on the flyweight throne, one of the most recently erected of fistic kingdoms. His winning of the title from little Jimmie Wild epitomized the passing of a tradition-a tradition which generations of Anglo-Saxons had built up with their fists, but which was already slightly frayed and worn by the fact that the Latins and Semitics had shown that the use of fists was not an art upon which the Nordic race alone had a monopoly.
