EFFECTS OF LIGHT.

A VERY IMPORTANT FACTOR IN DECORATING AND FURNISHING.

Consult the Resources of Natural Light Before Buying Papers or Fabrics—Brighten or Darken Your Rooms With the Coloring on Walls and Ceilings.

Natural light ought always to be considered as an important factor in the coloring and furnishing of a room.

There are rooms too bright for comfort. These should be toned down with color and fabrics. As dark colors absorb light, so hues, shades and tints of such colors tend to modify excessive light.

Yellow is the strongest of all the colors and the most diffusive of light. Hence the room that is deficient in light must be treated in this key.
