Berlin, Sept. 28.—The Japanese refugees who lived in Russian territory at the outbreak of the war, will be sent across the German frontier October 1, on their way to Japan. The refugees consist mainly of merchants and laborers from east Siberia. They have been detained under surveillance since the war broke out, but the Russian government did not interpose difficulties to their present movement nomeward. The active part taken by United States Ambrasador McCormick at St. Petersburg in collecting and forwarding the refugees and sending commissioners to distant ports of the empire, is greatly appreciated at the Japanese legation here. Considerable amounts of money and clothing have been collected in Germany to assist the needy Japanese. The German contributions in aid of the Japanese Red Cross Society since the outbreak of the war, amount to about \$10,000.
