THE KHEDIV'S DECREES. A RARITY PROCEEDING FROM THE BULLAN OF SUNDAY.

DeLesseps' Telegraph Line Stopped-The Preparations at the English War Office-Some Advice from a Paris Editor.

ALEXANDRIA, Aug. 15.-On account of the report that the regular as well as the Bedouins were in the neighborhood of Fort Meks, General Alison has reinforced the British post by a detachment of Highlanders and some marine artillery.

RECONCILING PARTY PURSUED. Col. Gerard of the mounted infantry, rode by daybreak to-day on a reconnaissance to within half a mile of the enemy's second line. The reconnoitering party was pursued by horsemen, of whom several were killed. Col. Gerard states that he accomplished the object of the reconnaissance.

DEPOSING THE SULTAN. Natives from Kair-el-Dwar report that Arabi on Sunday called a meeting of the Ulemas and obtained from them a fetwa deposing the sultan and naming the sheikh of Mecca as Caliph, Arabi, they also say, is organizing the Bedouins and appointing commanders for those at Charkis and at Garbi in Upper Egypt.

THE KHEDIV'S DECREE. Two decrees of the khedive were promulgated today. One authorizes the British admiral and commander of the force to occupy such points on the Suez isthmus as they consider useful for military operations against the rebels and inviting the Egyptian authorities to acquiesce in the fulfilment of the canal employees, with the decree. The other decree authorizes the British authorities to prevent the importation of coal and munitions of war along the coast between Alexandria and Port Said, and in the event of any contravention of this order to seize the prohibited articles.

DELESSEPS IS IMPEDING THE TELEGRAPH LINE. DeLesseps is impeding the telegraph line between Port Said and Suez. Operations are consequently suspended.

The departure of the life guards and the home guards for Ramleh will be delayed until the troops on board the transport Calabria are landed. MOBILE, ALA., Aug. 15.-Strict quarantines have been established against Pensacola on account of reports that yellow fever existed there.

MATAMOROS, TEXAS, Aug. 15.-Two hundred and fifty cases of yellow fever are now being treated. It is reported here that there are about twenty cases in the quarantine and many are being tried to break the infection. All the state officials are leaving. Disinfecting fires are constantly burning. The city is wrapped in gloom.

THE SCIENCE OF PACKING IN CHICAGO. "Shorts" in August Believers of Wheat.

CHICAGO, Aug. 15.-Recent inspection shows that a large amount of new pack here was packed exclusively from hard sides and that the regulating packing stipulations of the pack shall be packed from equal parts of hard and soft sides. It is stated that the packers to avoid discredit to their names are saying in the market that the pack and putting it in strips which will be used in place of shorts.
