KEPT BACK INFORMATION.

How a Brantford Assignee is Alleged to Have Made \$10,000. Judgment was delivered at Osgoode Hall vesterday in the suit of Morrison vs. Watts; in appeal by the defendant, A. Watts, from the judgment of Chief Justice Armour, who tried the action at Brantford in March, 1891. The appellant was the assignee for benefit of creditors of the firm of Morris & Watts, and purchased the estate at 30 cents on the dollar, selling it a month later at a considerable apparent profit. The action was brought by the plaintiff on behalf of himself and all other creditors of the insolvent firm for an account of the profits, estimated by the plaintiff at \$10,000, realized by Alfred Watts out of the estate, for payment of the amount thereot, and for the value of certain patents assigned by the defendant firm of Morris & Watts to the defendant Alfred Watts.

The court dismissed the appeal, affirming the judgment of the trial judge, which was that Watts received offers for the estate which as assignee he was bound to comfrom the judgment of Chief Justice Armour, which as assignee he was bound to com-municate to the creditors.


