SIXTEENTH YEAR PROOF FROM THE GRAVE. BODY OF THE MURDERED SWISS FRENCH RE EXHUMED.

It is believed that the Swiss French body of the murdered Swiss French was exhumed from the grave of the murdered Swiss French. The body was found in a state of preservation that would allow for a full examination of the remains.
