PLAN CIVIL ACTION

Dropping of Home Bank Criminal Charges not to Affect \$5,000,000 Suit.

Toronto.—The civil action for \$5,000,000 against the vice-president and directors of the defunct Home Bank of Canada, instituted by the depositors' committee on the grounds of malfeasance, will proceed despite the decision of the Attorney General of Ontario to drop the prosecutions of the directors, on conspiracy charges. Statement of claim will be delivered as soon as the courts convene again in September, according to A. W. Ballantyne, K. C., counsel for depositors.

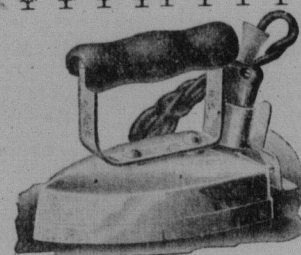
