## LECON D'ANGLAIS D'APRÈS LA MÉTHODE NATURELLE

In the picture, you see how many persons ? In the picture I see two persons. Or I see two persons in it.

Who are they ? I don't know who they are, I never before saw them. What are they? They are a man and a small boy.

What are their occupations ? If you mean at the present moment, the answer is that one is a seller and the other a buyer.

Which is the seller and which the buyer ? The boy is the seller and the man, the buyer.

What has the boy for sale ? I did not say that the boy had anything for sale.

I don't understand you, my young friend ; you said the boy is the seller, and now you state that you did not say the boy had anything for sale, tell me how can a person who has nothing for sale, be a seller ? I did not say that the boy had nothing. The boy had something ; it was not for sale ; yet he is selling it, is that what you mean ? That is exactly what I mean.

You should have said so at once. Please, sir, I try to answer every question I am asked as exactly and as briefly as possible.

I advise you to add the word clearly to your little rule. I see, sir, you want me to try to answer every question I am asked, as clearly, exactly and briefly as possible; I will try to satisfy you.

What is the man buying from the boy ? He is buying two fishes.

What are they ? They are trout, I think.

Where did the boy get them ? I suppose he caught them.

Where did he catch them ? He caught them in some stream, I suppose.

What was he doing when he caught them ? He was fishing when he caught them.

Describe his fishing outfit or equipment or tackle. It is of the simplest kind : it consists of a fishing rod made of a long and fairly thick branch of a tree from which the smaller branches have been roughly cut, of a fishing line, a piece of cord almost as long as the
