THE RAIKE'S CENTENARY.

THE EXHIBITION.

A new and commodious tent has been secured and pitched in a most conspicuous place. It has been floored, Reading Desks have been erected and every possible effort made to render it attractive and comfort-We have met with hearty cooperation on the part of the public in the form of donation of papers, &c. necessary. There are on fyle about 20 newspapers and a good supply of periodicals. Every facility for letter writing is furnished free of charge. Two meetings are held daily under the su-pervision of Messrs, H. J. Ware and W. P. Crombie. At the afternoon services we enjoy the presence and aid of strangers, and of our City Pastors. meetings were thinly attended the first week but during the last week the

attendance has been very large, and we have evidence that good has been accomplished.

EVANGELISTIC MEETINGS.

These are being held in Shaftesbury Hall every evening. The attendance is increasing and we are confidently expecting a rich blessing in connection with this effort to spread the Gospel news.
