III. To the extent to which the purchases of military equipment in Canad by the representative of the Netherlands Ordnance through the agent of the Canadian Government were in excess of the sum of \$8,400,000 referred to in paragraph I, sub-paragraph (c) above, such excess purchases were not included in this settlement.

If the foregoing is acceptable to the Government of the Netherlands as accurate statement of the agreement reached, this note and your reply therefor will be regarded as placing this agreement on record.
