

The Search is On for a Hotel Room in Spain

Two Spanish organizations will help you find what you're looking for

Finding a hotel room in Seville during Expo'92 won't be easy, but thanks to CORAL and "Sevilla Abierta", it will at least be possible.

The Official Centre for Accommodation Reservations for Expo'92, CORAL for short, was originally created to facilitate and coordinate accommodation arrangements for participants, but can now make reservations in a broad range of hotels, service apartments and residential complexes for the estimated 20 million visitors to Expo'92.

The agency reports that by 1992, approximately 15,000 hotel beds comprising Seville's traditional

supply will be significantly increased with the opening of more than 15 new establishments totalling 24,000 beds in three-to

five-star hotels, priced between \$200 and \$600 per night. Breakfast and transportation to and from the Expo site are generally included

in the price of the room.

Within a one-hour travelling time radius from Expo'92 grounds, 42,000 additional beds will be available and 90-minutes away, there will be another 35,000 beds.

The alternative to CORAL is "Sevilla Abierta". After a rigorous quality control and screening program, "Sevilla Abierta" has located and categorized over 50,000 beds in various places such as flats, private homes, apartment blocks and residential halls. Bed and breakfast schemes range from \$100 to \$200 per night.

CORAL says that travel agencies and tour operators now are able to access its computerized reservation system. For packaged holidays, call your travel agent or contact Gideon Tours in Toronto at (416) 923-7337.

CANADA PAVILION UPDATE

Beyond the scale model

The architectural vision of the Canada Pavilion, created by Bing Thom, is currently being made real as construction nears completion.

Zinc panels - sponsored by the Canadian Zinc Industry - are being installed on two sides of the building. This aspect of the exterior facade will be completed by the end of November. Exterior stucco work is more than 60 per cent finished.

Interior drywall finishing is nearing completion. Ramps ascending to the IMAX theatre are in place and suspension cables and glass railings are being installed.

A diffraction grating wall which will reflect light while water pours over it, will soon be installed.

Electrical/mechanical work is well under way and proceeding on schedule. Inside and out, the pavilion will stand completed by the end of the year.
