### PRAYERS.

Mr. Robb, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Report of the President and Financial Statement of the Honorary Advisory Council for Scientific and Industrial Research, for the year ending March 31, 1925.

Mr. King (Kootenay East), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Authentic text of a Recommendation adopted by the International Labour Conference (League of Nations) at its Sixth Session, Geneva, 16th June to 5th July, 1924, concerning the Development of Facilities for the Utilization of Workers' Spare Time.

And also,—Copy of Order in Council, P.C. 220, dated 15th February, 1926, concerning the same.

On motion of Mr. Lapointe, seconded by Mr. Meighen, it was resolved,—That a Message be sent to the Senate to acquaint their Honours that this House doth unite with the Senate in an Address to His Excellency the Governor General praying His Excellency to transmit the Joint Address of both Houses to His Most Excellent Majesty the King, expressing the deep regret and heartfelt sorrow at the demise of Her Majesty the late Queen Mother, in such a way as to His Excellency may seem fit, in order that the same may be laid at the foot of the Throne, and have filled in the blank space therein with the word "Commons";

And that the Clerk of the House do carry the said Message to the Senate.

Mr. Lapointe, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of correspondence between Rt. Hon. George P. Graham, and Rt. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, Prime Minister, concerning the former's resignation as Minister of Railways and Canals.
