

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL F³.

An Act for the relief of Maurice Amédée Tremblay.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Maurice Amédée Tremblay, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, bond salesman, has by his petition alleged that on the fifteenth day of September, A.D. 1928, in the parish of Notre Dame de L'Assomption des Eboulements, in the county of Charlevoix, in the said province, he and Jeanne Rénée de Sales La Terrière, who was then of the said parish, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her physical incompetence and refusal to consummate the said marriage, their marriage be annulled; and whereas the said marriage and the said incompetence and the non-consummation of the said marriage have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage annulled.

1. The said marriage between Maurice Amédée Tremblay and Jeanne Rénée de Sales La Terrière, his wife, is hereby annulled, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Maurice Amédée Tremblay may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Jeanne Rénée de Sales La Terrière had not been solemnized.
