SOFTWOOD LUMBER PRODUCTS EXPORT CHARGE ACT

MEASURE TO ENACT

The House resumed from Wednesday, January 21, consideration of the motion of Miss Carney that Bill C-37, an Act respecting the imposition of a charge on the export of certain softwood lumber products, be read the second time and referred to a legislative committee, and on the amendment of Mr. Turner (Vancouver Quadra), (p. 2382).

Mr. Roland de Corneille (Eglinton—Lawrence): Mr. Speaker, Bill C-37 should be trashed, as should the Memorandum of Understanding on softwood lumber which this Bill aims to implement. Why? Simply, if you look at the facts, Sir, you will see that not only is the softwood lumber industry being betrayed by this agreement but so are the Canadian people, not only by this agreement but by other evidences of Canada being sold out through other attempts to make agreements with the United States.
