THE form of the government in Nova Scotia approaches as nearly to that of the parent flate as poffible. The governor is named in England, and reprefents the Sovereign, as no laws are deemed valid without his affent. A council is named by him, whofe office is analogous to that of the Houfe of Peers, as holding a middle rank in their legiflative capacity, between the governor and the reprefentatives of the people. Thefe laft are chofen by the freeholders and burgeffes for each of the counties and large towns, and refemble the Houfe of Commons in England.
