lieu of some of our West-India Acquisitions; but altho' this Subject was so general, it appeared to me but ill-handled, and worse understood, till at length the Publick was obliged with that excellent Pamphlet, intitled, The Interest of Great-Britain with respect to our Colonies in North America.

This incomparable Treatife demonstrates, that no Acquisition whatever
can be put in Competition with the
entire Possession of Canada; it points out
to us not only the infinite and various
commercial Advantages which must arise
from this Possession, the vast Increase
of Sailors and Shipping, the Period it
will put to that disagreeable State of Dependency we are in upon the Northern
Powers for Ship Materials, such as Hemp,
Tar, Iron, Mass, &c. the prodigious additional Consumption of our Manusactures;
