

Bertillon Hopes French Bureau Will Study Problem of Women's Education.

PARIS, Sept. 20.—Dr. Jacques Bar-tillon has published in Le Matin a critical study of the effect of the higher education of women upon mar-

critical study of the effect of the higher education of women upon marriage, using as a basis the statistics returned by Mount Holyoke College, South Hadley, Mass. These figures show that whereas from 1842 to 1849 15 per cent. of the graduates remained single and 85 per cent. got married from 1900 to 1909 24 per cent. only found husbands.

Bertillon emphasizes as factors in the question the absence of marriage dowries in the United States and the relatively small part played by money in American marriages, mentioning also the social factor that graduates receive proposals of marriage only from men of relatively inferior class. He also emphasizes the facts that the completion of the education of American women is later than formerly and that women find the teaching profession opened wide to them. He then goes on to point out the abnormally large percentage of sterile women among American college graduates, which is 39 per cent. against the normal ratio of 10 per cent, thus concluding that only a few educated women marry while an extremely small number give posterity the benefit of their education by bearing children.
