THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL S-48.

An Act respecting The Northern Life Assurance Company of Canada.

Preamble. 1894, c. 122; 1924, c. 90.

Whereas The Northern Life Assurance Company of Canada, hereinafter called "the Company", has by its petition prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Name in French.

1. The Company may use, in the transaction of its business, either the name The Northern Life Assurance Company of Canada or the name La Nord-Vie du Canada, 10 Compagnie d'Assurance, or both of such names, as and when it so elects. It may sue or be sued in either or both of such names, and any transaction, contract or obligation heretofore or hereafter entered into or incurred by the Company in either or both of the said names shall be valid 15 and binding on the Company.

Existing rights saved.

2. Nothing contained in section 1 of this Act shall in any way impair, alter or affect the rights or liabilities of the Company, except as therein expressly provided, or in any way affect any suit or proceeding now pending or 20 judgment existing, either by or in favour of or against the Company, which, notwithstanding the provisions of section 1 of this Act, may be prosecuted, continued, completed and enforced as if this Act had not been passed.

Repeal.

3. Section 2 of chapter 122 of the statutes of 1894 25 is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

Classes of insurance authorized.

"2. The Company may undertake, transact and make contracts of insurance in any one or more of the following classes of insurance:
