

Government Concession, Limited,

Now Being Floated?

Montreal April 17.—A Star special cable from London says: The latest Klondike company is somewhat of a novelty. The prospectus of the Klondike Government Concession, Limited, will be issued tomorrow. The company will be formed to work a concession from the Cauadian Government, embracing two and one-half miles of Hunker Creek. The shares will be offered to the public and consist of 55,900 of priority shares at £1 each, and £25,000, which will provide-a working capital. These shares will be preferential as to capital and dividend, untfl one hundred per cent, has been paid on them. Afterwards they will rank like ordinary shares, which number 270,000, the whole capital of the company proposes to adopt the hydraulic system of mining, which can be carried on four months each year, day and night.
