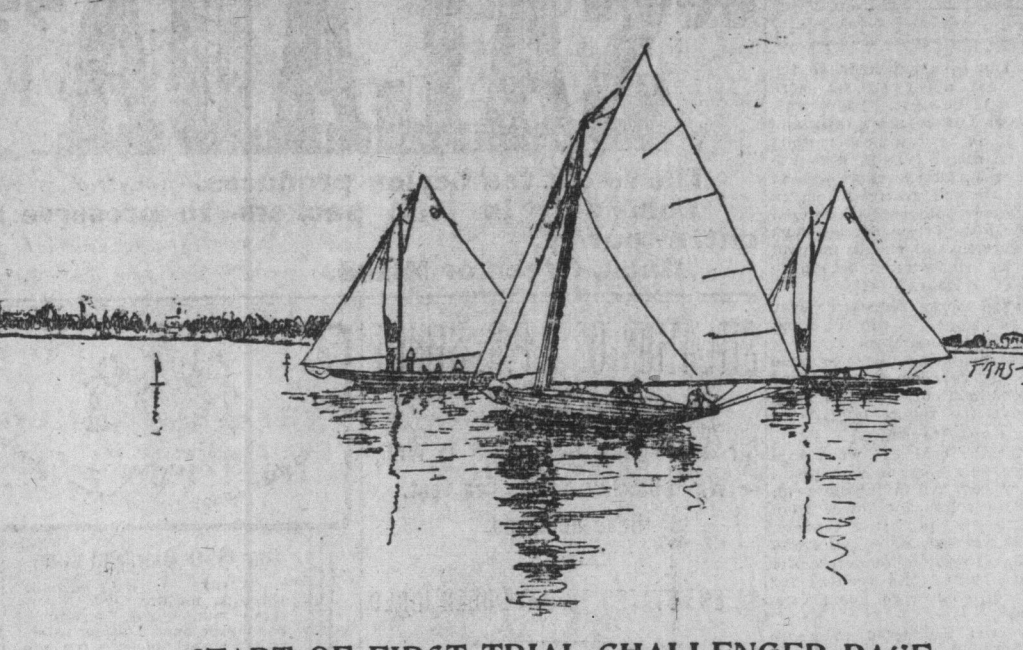

TORONTO INVITES DUKE OF YORK SIR OLIVER MOWAT APPROVING

Mayor Howland and Alderman Cox Drew Up the Necessary Letter and Submitted it to the Lieutenant-Governor—Program for Visit Outlined.

A joint meeting of the Board of Control and the City Reception Committee was held yesterday afternoon, and as a result the following letter regarding the visit of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York was sent to the Lieutenant-Governor, who warmly approves of the program that has been outlined:

Dear Sir,—We have the honor to be very glad to communicate to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor the following resolution passed by the Council of the corporation of the city of Toronto, in respect to the invitation and reception of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York:

Resolved, That His Worship the Mayor and members of the Board of Control be and they are hereby authorized, in conjunction with the Premier and members of the Ontario government, or separately, to extend a most cordial invitation to Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York and suite to visit this city during their tour through the Dominion of Canada this year, and that the Committee on Legislation and Reception be requested to consider and report at an early date a suitable program for the reception to be tendered to Their Royal Highnesses on the occasion of their approaching visit to this city.

Pursuant to this authority, after informal consultations with His Excellency, Your Honor and the Honorable the Premier of the province, we have the honor to request that you will kindly communicate to His Excellency, on behalf of the city of Toronto, the invitation of the city, in the terms of the foregoing resolution, and to express the exceeding pleasure with which the inhabitants of the capital city of this province look forward to the opportunity of loyally welcoming Their Royal Highnesses.
