

OPPOSES THE LEGISLATION.

N. Morang Writes Concerning Proposed Copyright Bill

In a letter addressed to the member of the Board of Trade, G. N. Morang opposes the action of the council of opposes the action of the council of that body in adopting a resolution of the Booksellers' and Stationers' section asking for legislation giving effect to a copyright bill "making it obligatory that a book shall be printed and bound in this country in order to secure Canadian copyright, and continue to be so printed and bound in order to retain such copyright, and that upon failure to print in Canada within a reasonable time provision shall be made by which the government may issue to a Canadian publisher a license to print in Canada, subment may issue to a Canadian publisher a license to print in Canada, subject to such safeguards as will secure to the owner of such book a reasonable royalty upon his work."

Mr. Morang outlines the history of copyright in Canada and discusses the question from his point of view as a publisher, claiming that the law at present is satisfactory and that to agitate for any changes would be illadvised.
