



Lizzi Wertheim, Famous As Beauty, Trapped, and Her Accomplice Executed.

BETRAYED GRAND FLEET Berlin Butterfly Led Life of Romance and Frivolity Until It Wrecked Her.

QUEEN OF SPIES

LONDON, Sept. 21.-Lizzi Luise Wertheim, fashionable demi-mondaine, once celebrated in the gay night life in Berlin, and later "queen of the German secret service." has died in the criminal lunatic asylum at Broadmoor. She was sentenced at the Old Balley on September 20, 1915, to ten years penal servitude, but after two years she lost her mind, and during the last few months has been so violent that attendants were almost constantly with her.

The death of Lizzi closes another sordid chapter of the German spy system. Her accomplice, George T. Breeckow, alias Reginald Rowland, who asserted he was an American citizen, was executed in the Tower of London on October 26, 1915.

Lizzi came from a highly-respected heim, fashionable demi-mondaine, once

PEACE NEGOTIATIONS REPORTED A FAILURE

> Withdrawal of Troops Prove To Be Stumbling Block.

WARSAW, Sept. 21 .- The peace negotiations between Lithuania and Poland have been broken off, and the Polish delegation has left Kalwarya and is returning to Warsaw.

Lithuania agreed to withdraw her troops behind the Foch line, but insisted that the Poles retire a similar distance behind the line they now occupy. To this the Poles refused to agree.

The announcement was made Monday that the council of the League of Nations had succeeded in getting Poland and Lithuania to agree to an immediate suspension of hostilities pending a settlement of their dispute.

BIG LOSSES RESULT FROM UPPER LAKES LABOR TROUBLES

SARNIA, Sept. 21.—Word was received here tonight that unsettled labor conditions at the Soo and other ports are delaying the sailing of the steamer Huronic, which will be unable to follow the schedule. The steamer should have arrived here yesterday morning. Unless there is an unlooked for improvement in the labor situation, the Huronic will not likely make this port until Wednesday or even later.

The steamer Hamonic has a complement of sailors, and so far it is not known if her crew also is likely to be affected by the strike.

Both boats carried heavy freight cargoes on their voyage to the Upper Lakes, and big losses have resulted from the disagreement between the Northern Navigation Company, Limited, and its employees.

Tonight it was announced that the finance committee of the city council at a meeting had considered the tenders received for \$128,000 worth of hydro bonds and had decided to dispose of the issue to the Dominion Securities Corporation, Toronto, at 93.493, a basis of approximately 6% per cent. The bonds replace bonds of the Sarnia Gas and Electric Light Company, and the proceeds will be turned over to the Sarnia Hydro-Electric system.
