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HEAVY CATTLE RUN AT UNION YARDS

Over Four Thousand on Sale Yesterday—Market Active and Firm.

LAMBS AGAIN ADVANCE

Sheep and Calves Were Steady, But Hogs Were Lower.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards yesterday consisted of 21 cars, 4047 cattle, 150 calves, 539 hogs, 2681 sheep and 1139 lambs.

Altho there was a large run of cattle at the Union Stock Yards yesterday, they were steady to firm. One load of choice steers, average weight 1400 lbs., sold at \$8.75, while 8 more carloads sold at from \$8 to \$8.45.

One carload of heifers, 1060 lbs., sold at \$7.90; cows, butlers, stockers and calves, average weight 1000 lbs., sold at \$7.40 to \$7.70.

Calves were active and sold at \$10.00 to \$10.50; calves, average weight 100 lbs., sold at \$10.00 to \$10.50.

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SEES COMPETITION FOR LATIN TRADE

John Barrett of Pan-American Union Forecasts Keen Rivalry.

ALLIES TO CO-OPERATE

Britain and France Will Eliminate Price Cutting Among Themselves.

New York, Oct. 16.—American business men expect the keenest competition from European nations, especially Great Britain, in the Latin American trade after the war, according to a statement issued tonight by John Barrett, director general of the Pan-American Union, who returned today from Bordeaux on the French liner Lafayette, after a trip to England and France.

Mr. Barrett went abroad to ascertain the British and French viewpoint of the effect of the war on the commercial and economic development of the American republics.

"I return convinced," said Mr. Barrett, "that the commercial, manufacturing, banking and general financial interests of the United States will make a great mistake if they count upon any general let up in British and French efforts to take care, after the war, of their trade and financial interests in Latin America.
