THE WEATHER

METEOLOGICAL OFFICE, Toronto, March 5.—(6 p.m.)—A pronounced depression is situated tonight over the western States, while pressure is comparatively high over the Great Lakes.

A very severe storm occurred during Saturday over the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland. Today the weather has been everywhere fair, except in the western provinces, where light snowfalls have been fairly general.

PRO-GERMAN PASTOR PARADED BY SOLDIERS

Rev. Rhinehardt Tappert Was Taken Out for Walk Along Berlin Streets.

OFFICERS RESCUED HIM

Mayor Hett Asks Ottawa for Investigation of Soldiers' Conduct.

BERLIN, Ont., March 5.—On Saturday night a mob of fifty soldiers called at the parsonage of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church, 439 Avenue street, and demanded that Rev. Rhinehardt Tappert accompany them down the street.

It was 10.45 p.m. when they called at the parsonage, and the members of the Tappert family were about to retire. Mr. Tappert, being already upstairs. One of the daughters answered the bell, but on seeing the mob quickly closed the door and locked it. This did not satisfy the intruders, who broke a panel in the door in an endeavor to get in. They did not get in, however, and the whole door was broken in and the crowd took possession of the house.

Pastor Tappert appeared only in his house suit, and they told him to put his hat and overcoat on as they wanted him to accompany them. He refused and they hustled him downstairs and out.

Sustained Slight Wound.

In going down the front steps he fell or was tripped, falling into a snow bank, and sustaining a nasty face wound. He was picked up and carried a few yards, when he was put on his feet and taken to walk.

With a soldier on either side of him, fifty others in the company and

three hundred citizens in the crowd, he was marched bareheaded down to King street and four blocks to the bank's office, thence back to Queen street and another four blocks to the barracks. Upon arrival there he was released and taken back to the parsonage in company of two lieutenants. The soldiers were sent to barracks, and the guard, which had been called out with fixed bayonets, kept the crowd from getting too near the building.

In Pulpit as Usual.

This morning Rev. Mr. Tappert occupied his pulpit as usual and confirmed a class of twenty boys and girls. About fifty soldiers attended the services but there was no demonstration. This evening Rev. Mr. Zarnke of the Lutheran Book Room occupied the pulpit. It was reported tonight that Rev. Mr. Tappert and family will leave Canada next Thursday for the United States. He is an American citizen, having been naturalized a few years ago at Meriden, Conn. It is stated that when he arrives in the States he will demand damages for the insult thru the state department at Washington.

Mayor Hett wired the authorities at Ottawa tonight requesting an investigation.
