Kinney Took Money in Advance and Jumped to Industrial Team.

Judge Landis, commissioner of baseball, yesterday denied the application for reinstatement filed by Walter W. Kinney, a pitcher with the Philadelphia Athletics, who was charged with violating his contract last May to play with an independent team at Franklin, Pa.

Kinney deserted the Philadelphia Club when the Franklin team offered him a \$500 increase in salary. From the evidence introduced, it was brought out that the Philadelphia Club had advanced him \$1000 preliminary to the start of the 1920 season; that he had been granted a sixty per cent. increase in salary, and that he left the club without notice, owing about \$500, which he has never attempted to repay.
