The Duke of Northumberland, who becomes lord lieutenant of his county in succession to Earl Grey, now transferred to a larger sphere of action, is the fifth of the seven Smithsonian dukes to hold that appointment. The exceptions were: The sailor fourth duke, who found more congenial occupation as first lord of the admiralty; and his cousin, the fifth duke, who was content to captain the Yeomen of the Guard. The earlier Smithsonians were not only lords lieutenant, but vice-admirals, of Northumberland. The second of these held both these offices, and was, besides, a general in the army, F.R.S., F.S.A., and, as was his father, K.G. The third duke had a wider experience of office. He was not cally lord-lieutenant and vice-admiral of the northern shire, but lord-lieutenant of Ireland and ambassador to Charles X. His widow held a memorable office also.
