ANNUAL MEETING.

The sixth Annual Meeting of the Toronto District W. C. T. U. was held at Headquarters, 56 Elm Street, October 13th.

Executive met at 10.30 a.m., the President in the chair; 22 members present. Meeting opened by singing "All hail the power of Jesus name," reading a portion of Scripture, and prayer, led by Mrs. W. L. Scott. Recording Secretary read the Minutes of last Executive meeting. On motion they were adopted. The Corresponding Secretary read a number of communications which were all attended to. President and Recording Secretary were appointed Delegates to a Meeting called to arrange for a Conference on social problems, Rev. Dr. Galbraith, chairman, A. C. Campbell, secretary. It was moved by Mrs. Moffatt, seconded by Mrs. Scott, "That superintendent of Franchise issue a call for the Women's Council and they, with the District Officers, take charge of Election matters." Carried.

Moved by Mrs. Hilborn, seconded by Mrs. Carlyle, "That we open a reading room at Headquarters and that the Magazines, Papers, etc., contributed be used afterwards for Jail work, and that after the appointment of New Superintendents they be called together to arrange a plan for having a Literary Department at Headquarters.
