SUNDAY SCHOOL UNION

The report on Sabbath schools and Young People's Societies was heard to day. The Council of Christian Churches in England and Wales is subject to taxation under a decision rendered by the King's Bench division today.

The church organization

The church organization based its case on the contention that its income was immune from government tax because it was a charitable institution, but opposing counsel argued that the society existed to agitate for the alteration of laws, including the abolition of liquor, and was therefore not a charitable institution.

Over 4,000 workers
