Address is Given by Rev. C. T. Clark—Collection is Taken For Orphans

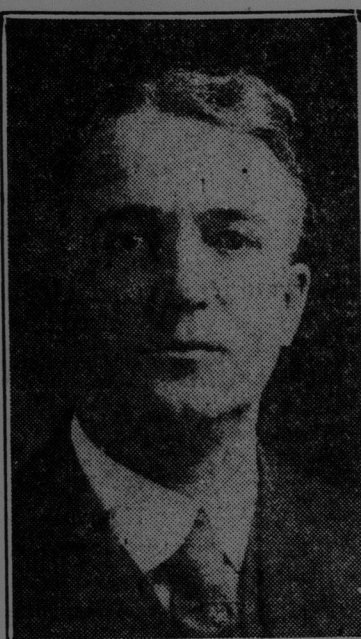

Makes Electricity Obey Human Voice

LONDON, Nov. 2.—A Nottingham inventor claims that he has an invention by which electricity can be controlled by spoken command. This inventor, L. H. Pearson, states that the device consists of an apparatus for transforming the sound waves in such a way that they operate and control an electric circuit. The invention has been patented as "Pearson's Acoustic Control" and at a demonstration given at an Electricity Exposition seemed remarkably successful. The inventor claims that he is able to say to an electrical motor, "start" and it starts; or to an electric lamp, "light" and it lights.

J. M. FLEWELLING DIES IN MONTREAL

M. L. A.-elect For St. Stephen-Milltown Succumbs After Operation

ST. STEPHEN, Nov. 1.—John Medley Flewelling, member-elect of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, died yesterday at the Royal Victoria Hospital, Montreal, where a few days ago he underwent an operation. He had been ill for several months and had been to Montreal for treatment a few months ago. John Medley Flewelling was born at Woodstock, N. B., June 28, 1879, a son of Rev. J. E. and Mrs. Flewelling. He was educated at Centreville, N. B., and in June, 1908, was married to Sarah J. McVay, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph McVay, of this town. Mr. Flewelling came here about 16 years ago and went into the insurance, real estate and brokerage business, in which, with his genial personality and his ability, he worked up a large business. In 1920 he was elected to the Legislative Assembly as one of the Con-

servative representatives for Charlotte. Again on Aug. 10, 1925, he was elected, although sickness prevented him from campaigning or taking any part in election. He scored a large majority and was to represent the new constituency of St. Stephen-Milltown.

He was a past president of the St. Stephen-Milltown Rotary Club. A member of Masonic Lodge, also of the St. Andrew's Society, a director of the St. Stephen Agriculture Society and a member of the Fredericton City Club and other societies.

SURVIVING RELATIVES.

Besides his wife, he leaves one daughter, Jean, two young sons, Joseph and John, his father, Rev. J. E. Flewelling, and several brothers and sisters. Miss Jean Flewelling, R. N. of this town, is a sister, and Sterling, of Dufferin, is a brother. Emery, another brother from the

West, is also here, having come last week to see his brother. The body will arrive at St. Stephen tomorrow noon. Funeral arrangements have not yet been made.

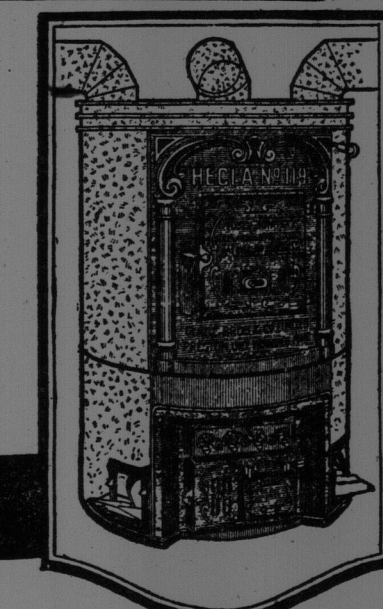
