TO REBUILD BURNT BUCTOUCHE PLANT

J. D. Irving, Ltd., May Begin Work Now But Bulk in Spring Likely

SHEDIAC, Dec. 2.—J. D. Irving, Ltd. of Buctouche, which lost five mills by fire last month, has decided to rebuild practically the entire plant, it is announced. The mills to be erected will include the long lumber mill, box plant, shingle mill and shoop plant. Operations may begin this season, but it is probable the bulk of the work will be done in the spring.

It is the intention of the corporation to install up to date machinery and all modern improvements. The burned buildings and machinery with some lumber, were valued at \$100,000, and employed more than 100 men when running in full.

CALLERS YESTERDAY AT HEALTH CENTRE

Interested callers at the Health Centre yesterday were Mrs. Lillian M. Savage and Mrs. Vincent Mathews, of Campbell. They said they were members of the recently formed home nursing classes being held on the island with Miss Agnes Joyes as instructor. Miss Joyes has added three new classes to the four which were organized in Campbell recently by Miss S. A. Barrington, provincial organizer of Red Cross, and these latest formed classes will add appreciably to the total enrollment in New Brunswick.

On Nov. 13 the records showed that there had been 1,699 pupils enrolled in Red Cross home nursing classes in the province and of these 976 had already received attendance cards showing they had completed the course and made a high percentage of attendance. There were 326 pupils taking the course on Nov. 15 and 357 pupils had made partial attendance at courses which they had not completed. Of all those who had attended courses which had been completed there were only eight who attended less than half of the lessons of the course.
