IN UNITED STATES. Forty-one New York Stock-brokers Under Indictment Following Failures. With forty-one New York stockbrokers under indictment for bucket shopping or grand larceny following the wholesale business failures of the last few weeks, W. S. Silkworth, president of the Consolidated Stock Exchange, last week offered District Attorney Banton his support in obtaining legislation which would compel brokers to be licensed.

THE CATTLE TRADE WILL BE ACTIVE

(Montreal Gazette). With exchange at the present level, the volume of live stock exports should be much larger in 1922 than in 1921. The reason that so many of our north-west cattle were shipped to the United States last fall was owing to the high rate of American funds then—about fifteen per cent, and the pound sterling was worth about \$4.20, so that the premium on American funds went long way towards paying the duty on Canadian cattle entering the United States. At the present time the pound sterling is worth \$4.53 and the premium on American funds 1 1/2 per cent, therefore shipments to the United States will be out of the question unless there is a very marked advance in prices in that country for cattle.
