## PLAN REVIVAL OF BICYCLE RACING

Meets May Be Held in St. John, Fredericton, Halifax, Yarmouth and Summerside.

Bicycle enthusiasts were put in large numbers last Friday at the annual meeting of the Canadian Wheelmen's Association, held at the Queen's Hotel, Toronto, with A. L. Louis Rubenstein, the noted Montreal sportsman, in the chair. Plans for 1922 were discussed, the various district chairmen having very optimistic views of the season's outlook for wheelmen. In all parts of Canada, Chairman F. A. O. Johnstone of the racing board outlined the activities of the association last year, during which no less than sixty race meets were sanctioned. William Gladish, chairman of the racing board for eastern Ontario, in his report, showed that the recent action of the Canadian Wheelmen's Association in dividing the provinces into districts and appointing chairmen for each district, has generally assisted in increasing cycling activities throughout the dominion.

It was announced that Bob Falconer, the first vice-president, will make a tour of the maritime provinces for the purpose of boosting the bicycle game. He will leave June 1. Plans are already under way for the promotion of race meets in Fredericton, N. B.; St. John, N. B.; Halifax, N. S.; and Summerside, P. E. I., with possibly a race meet in Yarmouth, N. S. Gladish, arranging for the first race meet in territory for May 24, and for practically every month throughout the racing season. H. E. Richard, chairman of the racing board for the maritime provinces, will, of course, act in conjunction and give his assistance for the race meet to be held in June.

The treasurer's report was very favorable. The association has a surplus this year of several hundred dollars, which will put the association on a better financial footing and in such a position that they will be able to give considerable time towards the promotion of race meets throughout all sections of the dominion. The secretary's report was received, and the benefit of the monthly executive meetings was pointed out, and it was decided to carry on the monthly meetings of the executive.

There were a number of requests for the dominion and provincial championships, and the matter has been left in the hands of the chairman of the racing board and the executive to decide where would be the best place to have the championship race on July 1.

Many old familiar faces were out at the annual meeting, including those of T. B. McCarthy, former champion; James Poole, Dr. P. E. Deolittle, Alderman F. M. Humphrey, G. M. Murphy, and many others well known to the bicycle business.

The election of officers resulted as follows: President, J. H. Roos, Waterloo; president, Louis Rubenstein, Montreal; vice-president, Robert Falconer, Toronto; secretary, D. E. Rogers, Toronto; treasurer, J. H. Smith, Toronto. Following are the chairmen of the various committees: Rules and regulations, J. W. Gibson; transportation, A. E. Humphrey; Toronto; rights and privileges, J. H. Rawlinson, Toronto; membership, R. E. Copeland, Toronto; racing board, F. A. O. Johnstone; assistant secretary, George Sheppard; roads and touring, L. B. Jennett, Weston; auditors, George Sheppard and L. B. Jennett.
