FOR RECIPROCITY

WITH AUSTRALIA

(Canadian Press Despatch)

Ottawa, Ont., July 11—Reciprocity between Canada and Australia is the subject of negotiations between the government here and that of the commonwealth now that the latter has finally adopted its protective tariff.

Sir George Foster has called Premier Meighen asking that incidental to the London conference he take up with Premier Hughes of Australia the subject of entering into reciprocal arrangement between the two countries.

By the Australian tariff a preference is given to Great Britain, but to no other dominion or country. The effect is, however, a general provision authorizing reciprocal negotiations with other dominions, and this is now to be availed of in the hope of developing trade between Canada and Australia.

Cannd Goods Flurry

Although the big canners have stated that they will not announce the price of canned peas until Aug. 1, the intimation made in these columns about a month ago that higher canned goods could be looked for this fall is being borne out. At that time the withdrawal of price lists led the wholesalers to believe that an upward revision was in sight, and such was the case as far as one independent company at least was concerned. The price for canned peas just received by the wholesalers from the company in question is 10 cents a dozen higher than the price prevailing a week ago.
