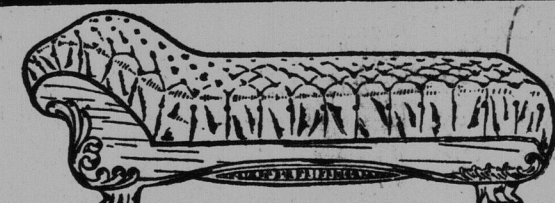

GERMANY AND POWER

Baron Von Der Goltz, a German
Field Marshal

This is No. 4 of a Series of Ten Articles Written For The Times

A great soldier, military authority and writer, General von der Goltz, was appointed governor-general of Prussia in 1912. His book, "A Nation in Arms," gives the militarist viewpoint. He is against disarmament as he thinks that "inherent selfishness" and "national egoism" are too strong in all nations to adequately carry it out.

He thinks Ruchel was right in saying "the soul of the Prussian army is in its officers." He admits that "the officers even today (1888) are chosen from the aristocracy of the people, yet this means the aristocracy of education has taken lead in social and political life." He upholds strongly the officer class and would give them many social privileges. He tries to despise wealth and thanks God that the "majority of officers are as poor as church mice." In all of this our general says but little about the common soldier.

He deprecates the growth in "peace" and "democracy," as it is "unfavorable to the warlike development of the people." He condemns resistance to militarism, as follows: "The shibboleth expressed by the word militarism is the product of our time. We speak of it as if it were a parasite and fed upon the vitals of the people. The question is: are we doing enough in view of the secret envy which Germany's rapid growth has aroused. Our milder mannered time regards with distaste the application of force. Those in command are required to execute their difficult task by methods of moderation, by im-

posing convictions and not by exercising the full powers of authority. He denounces those "false apostles" who condemn war, and adds, "Victory brings might, might riches, but prosperity luxury." He says: "The more civilized, the more wealthy a nation becomes the greater the capacity for pleasure and indulgence. It shrinks from effort and comes gradually to estimate property and ease more highly than the brutal pursuit of war."

This was written in 1890. What did he think of "brutal" war when he governed Prussia in 1912? Was he ashamed of what he had written in 1890? Again he says, "The war-like spirit must not be allowed to die out among people, neither must the love of peace get the upper hand, for all the greater would be the calamity at the moment of awakening."

What good to have pulpits and priests, bells and Bibles, churches and churches if this is to be taught the people? If Von der Goltz' teaching be approved then away with church, Christ and Christianity, for we are no more than snarling, fighting beasts. This brazen soldier dares to say that the humilitas of Prussia in 1806. A non-soldier would say that Napoleon and war were responsible. He, like the rest, wants the sword to be always in the hand, armor to be on, guns ready. Peace, arbitration, dis-
