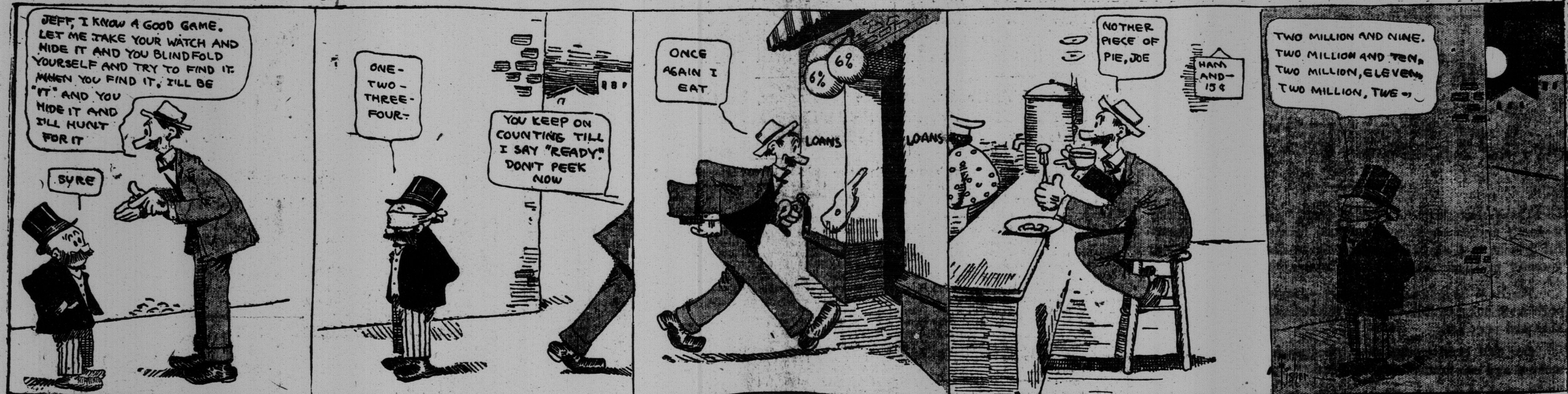

Automatic R. R. Stops
The use of automatic stops on railroad systems has been found entirely practicable on the subway system of New York and the tunnels under the Hudson River where they have been experimentally tried and in the course of several months has not been known to fail. The general adoption of these devices will eliminate a great number of accidents, as a very large percentage of fatalities on railroads are caused by running past danger signals.

Horshoes of Rope
Horshoes of rope are largely made up of in Germany and some other foreign countries. The rope is sometimes reinforced with wire and sometimes it is tarred and after being cut and shaped is secured to an iron shoe which is secured to the animal's hoof. While its appearance is not as neat and elegant as a shoe of metal, the soft cushion of rope is very grateful on the animal's feet.
