

UNION POINT SCHOOL PRACTICALLY MADE ANEW

Remodelled and Enlarged to Meet the Increasing Requirements-Festival to Be Held

The school building at Union Point

Fairville, has been extensively remodelled and two additional rooms have been provided. It now presents a very beautiful appearance having two stories instead of one as formerly, with half pitched roof of handsome design covered with galvanized iron roofing material. The basement of the old building has been strengthened to half solutions resting on concrete foundations. by brick columns resting on concrete foun-dations, while the new addition for hall dations, while the new addition for hall and stair room is supported by an entire wall of concrete. The interior of the new work is furnished with hardwood floors and burlap wainscoating and slate black boards. The old rooms have also been much improved being better lighted and having better accommodation for hat and cloak rooms, exits and entrances.


