EXPROPRIATE LANDS, SAYS W. M. JARVIS

Instead of disposing of the lands in freehold lots, the grantees introduced, or possibly invented, during the latter years of the eighteenth century, the form of renewable lease still common, the use of which, has, I believe, retarded the development of the city and led in many cases to difficulties as serious as those which resulted from the leasehold tenure in Ireland and Prince Edward Island, which it has long since been found necessary to do away with.

Further than this, when in 1785 Governor Carleton issued, under the supposed authority of his commission from the crown, the charter of the City of St. John, once paraded as a royal charter until the fact was brought out that Governor Carleton was called to account by the house of assembly for issuing it at all, and only escaped censure by showing that he had summoned a meeting of the provincial legislature which had confirmed the charter by an enactment (XXVI George III, cap. XI) upon which its validity depends, it was provided that the city corporation might hold land within the city limits then ungranted for building or other purposes vested in the city subject, however, to the restriction that the real estate which the city corporation should hold in their possession at any one time should not exceed in the whole the clear yearly rent or value of two thousand pounds.
