



ing taxes:

1. One per cent. tax on all sales of manufacturers, wholesalers or importers, except on coal and foods for man and beast.

2. Excise taxes running from ten to fifty per cent. on specified high priced goods, luxury articles made of gold or silver or for adornment, or recreation, whether imported or manufactured in Canada.

3. Heavy excise taxes on all spirituous liquors from thirty cents a gallon on ale, beer, porter, stout, to two dollars a gallon on rum, whiskey, brandy, gin, etc., and three dollars a gallon on champagne and sparkling wines.

4. Increase of five per cent. in all taxation on incomes of \$5,000 and upwards, taxes to be paid in part or in whole when making returns, and heavy penalties provided for errors or failure in making returns.

7. Twenty-five to fifty cents on every pack of playing cards

8. A license fee of two dollars on every business man dealing

The only reductions in taxation are: first—the removal of the extra customs war tax of seven and one-half per cent. which brought \$30,000,000 last year, mainly drawn from articles on which the still higher excise taxes are now levied; second—the repeal of the duty on moving picture films; third—the retention of the business profits tax, but increasing the exemption of profits from seven to ten per in various luxury articles mentioned. tax, but increasing the exemption of profits from seven to ten per cent., and decreasing from twenty-five to twenty per cent. the tax on profits above ten and less than fifteen per cent on all businesses having a capitalization not less than \$25,000 and not more than \$50,000 except where more than twenty per cent. of the profits was gained in 1917 or 1918 from munition industries; and fourth—some minor tariff reductions, letting typewriters, books and other articles for the blind in free

Present tax is modified by increasing the exemption allowed from seven to ten per cent. and changing the schedule of taxation to the following:

Motor cars—Excise tax on Canadian manufactured and imported cars increased from ten to fifteen per cent. Sales tax—One per cent on the sales of all manufacturers, wholesale dealers, jobbers or importers (not retailers). This tax not to apply to large lists of essential 100dstuffs, coals, anthracite or butimous coal, or goods exported.

Stamp duties—Existing tax on checks continued, but rate increased on bills of exchange and promisory notes. Two cents for each additional \$100, or fractional part thereof.

Stamp duties on patent medicines, etc., henceforth to be affixed by manufacturer or importer instead of retailer as now. Film tax of fifteen cents a film for each day used abolished because of inequality of incidence as between small and large theatres.

All the above taxes are effective from tomorrow the 19th instant.

Playing cards—Twenty-five cents a pack on cards selling at wholesale rates not over twenty-five dollars per gross packs, and fifty cents a pack on cards above twenty-five dollars per gross packs.

Beer, wines and spirits—Increase in excise duties on beer of thirty cents a gallon; spirits, two dollars a gallon, and on sparkling wines three dollars a gallon.

In future income tax returns must be accompanied by a check for at least twenty-five per cent or the whole of the amount estimated to be payable. If paid in installments, interest at six per cent is to be charged and payment in full is required within six months after return is made by means of three equal by monthly installments.
