SAW SWATOW HORROR

English Comedian Tells of Tidal Wave's Ravages.

Vancouver, B. C., Sept. 2.—Liners of 2,000 tons lying high and dry miles from tidewater, houses mixed into an indescribable mass, and thousands of bodies floating round the harbor—these were the sights which met the eyes of Talbot O'Farrell, English comedian, and his wife, when they arrived at Swatow, China, soon after the terrible tidal wave had devastated that town and the surrounding country about six weeks ago. Mr. and Mrs. O'Farrell arrived in Vancouver from the Orient on the Canadian Pacific liner Empress of Russia after filling engagements in Australia, New Zealand and the Far East. He is on his way to London. Relief measures were just being properly organized when Mr. O'Farrell arrived on the scene and the unfortunate natives were finding it hard to keep body and soul together. He says that Chinese river pirates were quickly on the scene and added to the terror of the people. The European survivors were nearly all taken to Hong Kong and arrived in that city practically destitute. No fewer than 40,000 bodies were recovered and many thousands were washed out to sea by the receding wall of water, he states. It was found impossible to bury all the bodies and the dead were burned in huge pyres to save the living from pestilence. Food, clothing and medical supplies were soon pouring in by the shipload to the scene of the disaster. The difficulties of keeping the survivors alive and caring for the injured were greatly increased by the fact that all water had to be transported from Hong Kong, nearly 200 miles distant by boat.
