

been infected thereby, to be forthwith destroyed, or otherwise disposed of in such a manner as he may deem proper, or as may be directed, as provided by this Act.—[42 Vict., c. 23, s. 7.]

E. The Governor may, by Order in Council, when the owners are reported by the Minister of Agriculture not guilty of any negligence or offence against the provisions of the first seven sections of this Act, order a compensation to be paid to the owners of animals slaughtered under the provisions of this Act as follows: Where the animal slaughtered was affected by infectious or contagious disease, the compensation to be one-third of the value of the animal before it became so affected; but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed twenty dollars; in every other case the compensation to be two thirds of the value of the animal, but so that the compensation do not in any case exceed forty dollars; in all such cases the value of the animal is to be determined by the Minister of Agriculture; but if such owners or their representatives have been guilty of an offence against any of the first seven sections of this Act, no valuation shall be made, and no compensation shall be paid to them.—[42 Vict., c. 23, s. 14.]
