And how long was this furlough for? 0. If I am right, it was fourteen days. Fourteen days furlough and A. four days travelling time. You mentioned that you got married, I understand, in 1942. Q. A. That's right sir. And you were called up on the first part of December, 1942. Yes, sir. A. Now will you tell the Court just what attempt you made to get 0. allowance - dependent's allowance for your wife and three children? I first seen Lieut. Cameron, he was our Troop Commander. Where was this Lieut. Cameron? This was at Esquimault where we were on Commando Training. He advised me to go to the Padre. The Padre told me that I would have to be with this woman for at least two years before Dependent's Allowance could be given here. I then asked to have half of my pay sent over to her for the benefit of the child. This was not done. How many children didyou have? One, approximately a month old at that time. A. And you said your pay wasn't assigned. My pay wasn't assigned, no sir. My pay was refused for what reason I don't know but they said it couldn't be done. It was refused. Where did you go on your furlough? 0. To Swift Current, Saskatchewan. A. 0. When did you go to Taber, Alberta? I believe it was on or about the 1st part of August, 1943, A. 0. You moved down to Taber from Swift Current. A. Yes, sir.

Where did you send these telegrams from? Was that Swift Current?

Swift Current right direct to the 9th Anti-Aircraft Battery, to Wajor

Are you sure of that, that was the address on the telegrams?

In August, 1943.

Yes, sir.
