THE ASSONAN DAM PREVENTS SERIOUS DROUGHT IN EGYPT

Where it Not for This Great Work, the Water Supply Would Now be Very Scanty.

CAIRO, April 3.—Sir William Garstin has returned to Cairo from the Upper Nile. He visited the southern reaches of the Nile, a branch of the Nile which falls into the main branch of the Nile about 40 miles above Khartoum, with the object of inspecting this short channel, which is known to connect the White Nile with the Nile. Sir William Garstin found this channel closed by sand, although last year a steamer was able to force its way through it.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATION

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 16 not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans or Sub-agency (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years from the date of entry.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) life position for right man. J. M. Gillingham, 18 Millstone Lane, Toronto.

(4) The term "vicinity" is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
