THE ASSONAN DAM PREVENTS SERIOUS DROUTH IN EGYPT

Were it Note for This Great Work, the Water Supply Would Now be Very Scanty.

CAIRO, April 3—Sir William Garstin has returned to Cairo from the Upper Nile. He visited the southern reaches of the Bahr-el-Seraf, a branch of the Nile which falls into the main branch of, the White Nile about 40 miles above Taufikia, with the object of inspecting this short channel, which is known to connect the White Nile sir William Garstin found this channel closed by sudd, although last year a steamer was able to force its way through it.

The water level in the Bahr-el-Seraf and the Bahr-el-Jebel, and in the great swamp through which they pass, is exceptionally low at present, and everything seems to point to a very scanty summer supply in Egypt this year. But for the Assouan dam there would be cause for some fears regarding the cotton crop. The existence of the reservoir, however, removes all cause for alarm. The dry state of the swamp will greatly facilitate the survey operations undertaken in connection with the projects for increasing the Upper Nile discharge. All the most recent information proves how immense is the area of these marshes. Opposite to Shambeh the width of the flooded area cannot be less than 35 miles and is probably even more.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATION!

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he se desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
