WABANA'S MATE GETS SIX MONTHS.

Largest Oil Tank—Steamer and Schooner Collide—Disasters—Dangers to Navigation.

Cartagena, June 26.—Stm Colonial from Liverpool to Colon, went ashore near to the entrance of this harbor but will probably come off with assistance undamaged; stm Magician is standing by.

Hantsport, N. S., July 3.—Schr William M. Gaffney, stranded shortly after leaving Mattland with cargo for New York; she was floated and towed here full of water; the vessel's cargo will be discharged and an examination made.

Tampa, Fla., July 7.—Steam schr Francis Hyde, Lawrence, from New York, arrived today. Apparently received no damage from grounding near Miami except to part cargo of cement from water.

London, July 5.—Stmr Fuert Bismarck (Ger.), from Havana on July 15, for Hamburg, arrived at Havre and reports fire broke out in No. 2 hold during voyage; the fire has been extinguished; damage unknown.

New York, July 8.—Stmr La Navarre (Fr.), reports July 2, lat 28 20 N, lon 71 20 W, passed a very large buoy with its lantern broken.
