ST. JOHN'S FINE CHANGE TO DO TOWN PLANNING

"A town planning act was passed in New Brunswick in 1912. The absence of any definite action on the part of any of the cities in New Brunswick is probably due to the difficulties created by the somewhat novel procedure involved in preparing a town planning scheme. The New Brunswick Act is a good one, and there is no reason why a satisfactory scheme should not be prepared under it. It is satisfactory to learn that St. John, the largest city in New Brunswick, has decided to take steps to prepare a scheme under this act. A Town Planning Commission has been appointed, consisting of a Mayor, two commissioners and two ratepayers, and a resolution has been passed that the commission apply to the legislature for authority to prepare a scheme. The Board of Trade of St. John has approved of the steps taken and the movement has enthusiastic support from the press and the public. A large area has been selected, comprising an area taking in all the unoccupied land within the city limits and considerable portions of the county parishes adjoining both sides of the city.
